Yeah. It's this trendy "light novel" (young adult books).

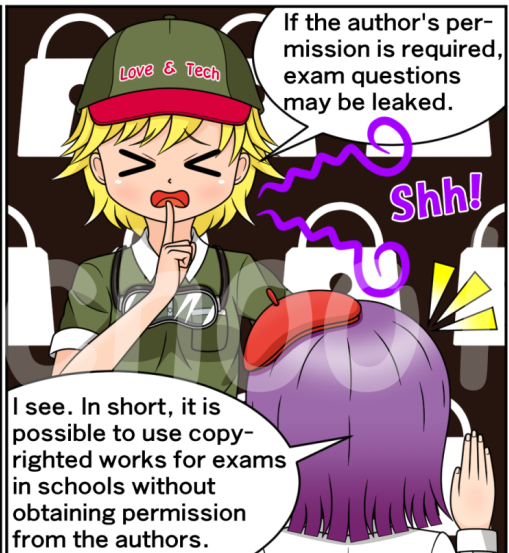
Because of that, I was able to finish the exam without drawing comics.

I don't think, "I read this novel on an exam, so I won't buy it."

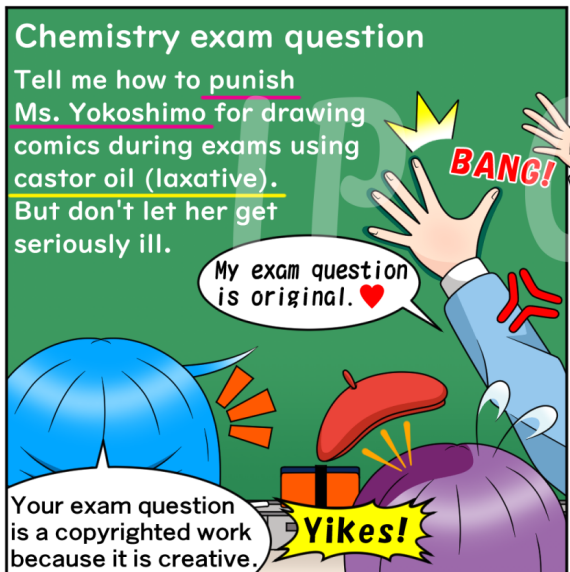
And the use of the works for school exams doesn't cause significant losses to their authors.

I see. In short, it is possible to use copyrighted works for exams in schools without obtaining permission from the authors.



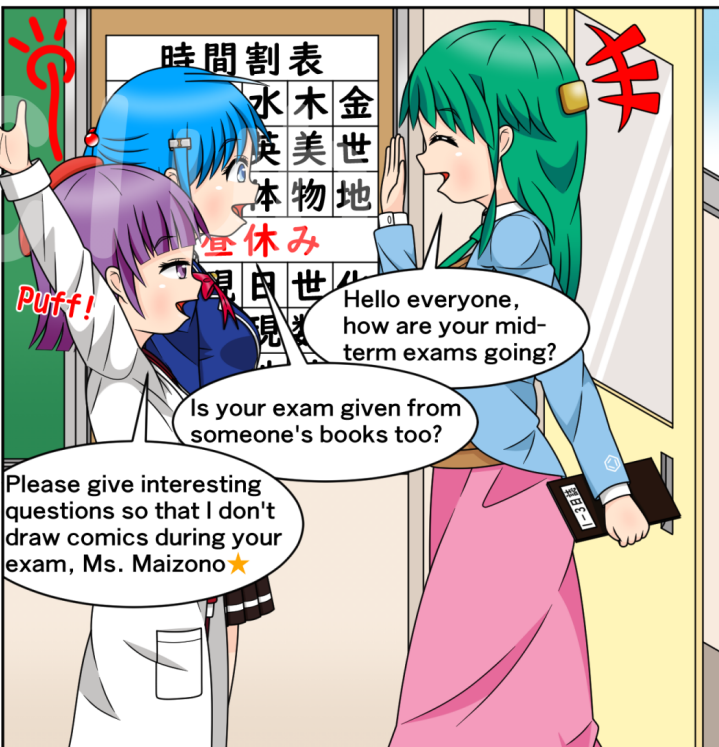
Chemistry exam question
