There were many inmates who wanted to work because they had many free times.



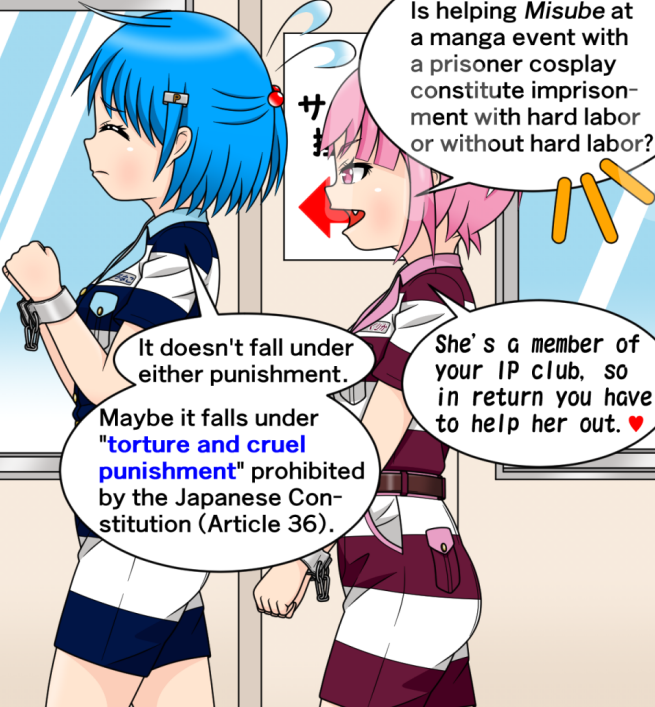
For some reason, the two are wearing prisoner's costumes.
