



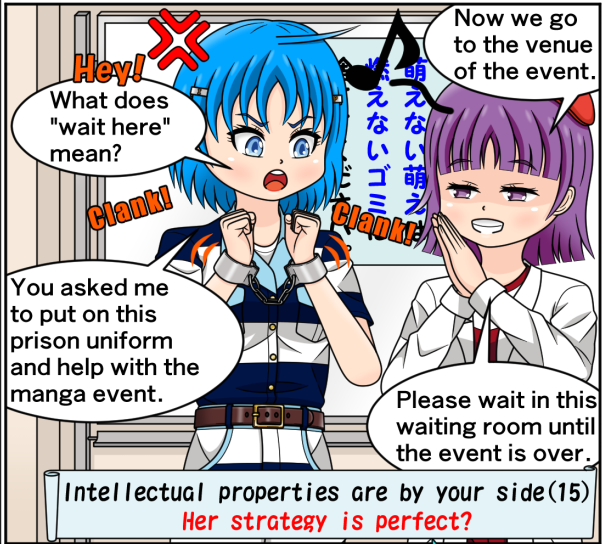
Be-beep!

Hey! What does "wait here" mean?

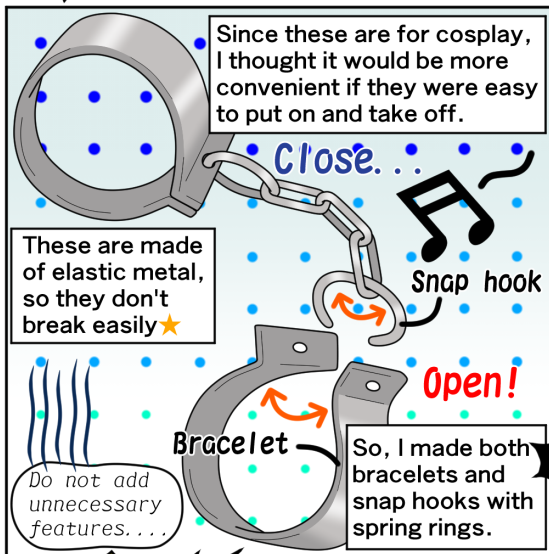
Clank! Clank!

These are made of elastic metal, so they don't break easily★

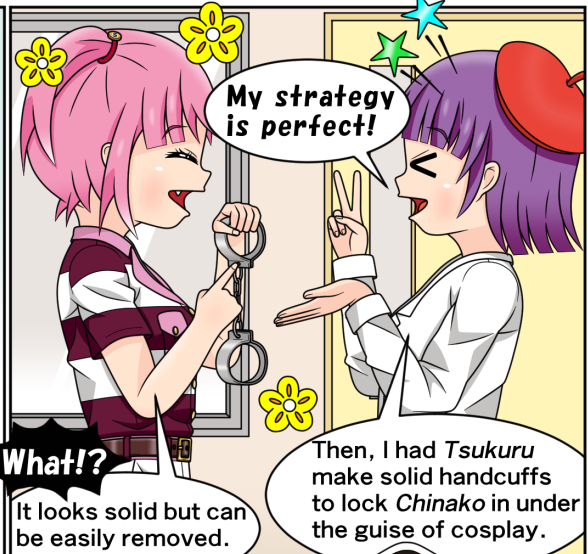
Snap hook

So, I made both bracelets and snap hooks with spring rings.

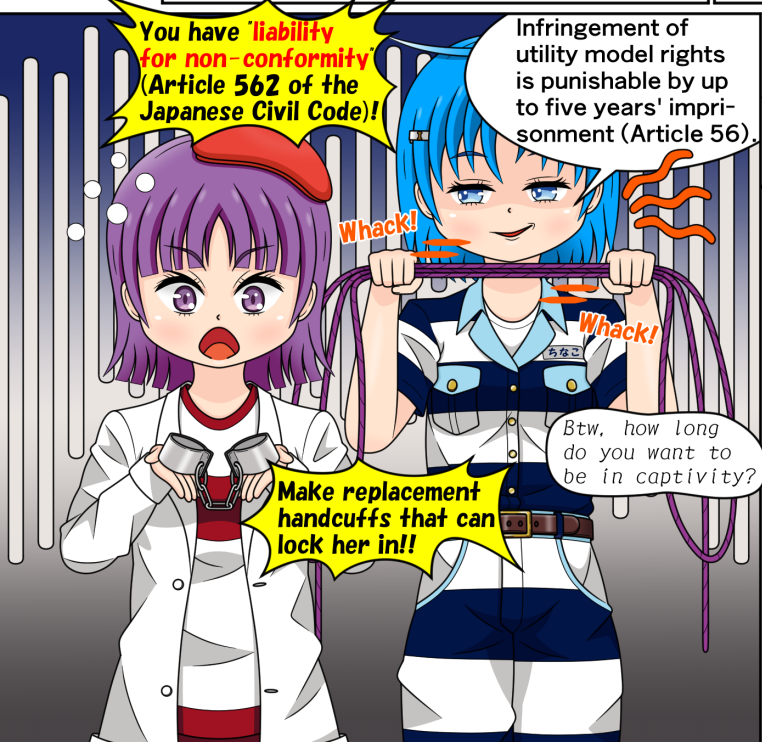


My strategy is perfect!

It looks solid but can be easily removed.



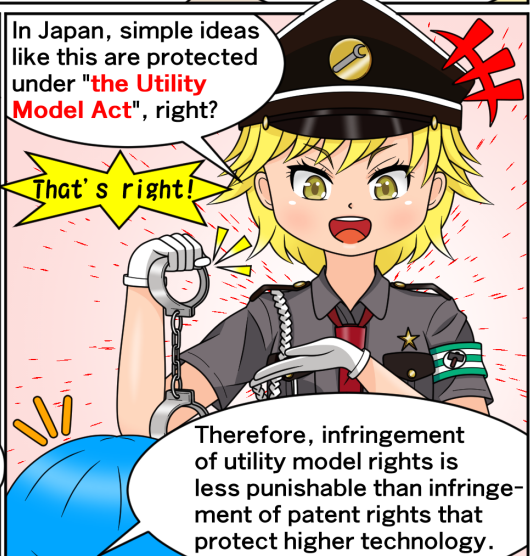
You have liability for non-conformity (Article 562 of the Japanese Civil Code)!
